**Important Information:** Parents are required to sign their children in/out of the office for late arrival or early dismissal. We do not allow pick ups within the last 30 minutes of the school day, \* Please do not park in the fire lane at anytime.

Dress Code: All school uniforms must be worn so that when the body is standing straight, clothing must cover the chest, back, torso, stomach, and lower extremities from armpit to armpit to mid-thigh. The Galileo School uniform consists of a polo shirt with the Galileo School logo from Lands' End. Pants, skirts, shorts, or skorts must be khaki/tan-colored. Headwear: Hats may be worn as long as they do not cause a distraction. No costume headpieces. Footwear: Students must wear closed shoes at all times. Crocs, backless shoes, sandals, wheelies, open toed shoes and flip flops may not be worn. Spirit Fridays: Students may wear Galileo PTO/spirit shirts to school on Fridays with jeans or jean shorts as an alternative to their khaki-colored bottoms. On all other days, students must wear their polo shirts (elementary) or Galileo t-shirt (middle school) with the Galileo School logo and khaki colored bottoms. Out of Uniform Days: Once a month, Galileo will implement a dress down day. Students may wear non-uniform clothing that otherwise adheres to dress code policy. Costumes and pajamas are not permitted. **School Lunch:** Lunch may be purchased for \$3.50 (Elementary) & \$3.75 (MS), and will be supplied by Seminole County Food Services. Parents can pre-pay for lunches by check, or use MySchoolAccount.com online using a credit card. \* If your students arrive more than 10 minutes late in the morning, please be sure to bring them a lunch from home. ## Riverbend Galileo Car Line Procedures 2023-2024

\*\*\*For the safety and security of our students, parents cannot use cellphones in Carline\*\*

## **Morning Car Line Procedures**

Carline will open at 7:50 a.m. and close at 8:25 a.m. Cars will drive from the main entrance located off Cameron Ave. Once you have pulled into the entrance, you will take an immediate right, looping past the playground and around the back of the building. Parents should line up in both lanes of the driveway and stop at the stop sign. Parents should wait to be directed forward into a single line to drop off student(s).

Once all children have unloaded and after being flagged to leave, parents will be directed to carefully pull forward through the parking lot, exiting to Cameron Ave (left) or onto SR 46 (right).

Once the car line closes @ 8:25 a.m., parents can start pulling up in the lane closest to the front office and safely drop off their students. At 8:30 a.m., parents must exit their cars and sign children in as children are late at that time.

<u>Students cannot be dropped off until Galileo Staff are present in carline to receive them after 7:50 a.m.</u>

## Afternoon Car Line Procedures

Students will be dismissed in zones in order to provide an efficient system for pickup. Car Line will open at 3:20 p.m. for kindergarten-second grade dismissal. Students in grades 3-5 will be dismissed beginning at 3:30 and Middle School students will be dismissed at 3:40 p.m. If a car is picking up students in multiple time brackets, all students will be ready for pick-up at the time the oldest student is dismissed. Parents must arrive in the car line at their zone time or later to pick up their children.

At the Back-to-School Event, parents will be given their two car line tags per family, with their child's first and last name and zone number one, two, or three. Any additional tags needed will be \$1.00 per tag. Requests for additional tags should be emailed to Abby Dueitt (abby.dueittegalileogiftedschool.org). When using the car line, please have this card clearly displayed, hanging from the rearview mirror or your dashboard where the car line volunteers can see it. If you have multiple families in the same vehicle, please clearly display each card. Student names will be announced to facilitate a quick transition of students to their waiting parents in the car line. Parents without cards will be directed to pick-up their children in the front office.

Zone 1 (3:20 dismissal for grades K-2) cars will drive in the main entrance located off Cameron Ave. Once you have pulled into the entrance, you will take an immediate right, looping past the playground and around the back of the building. In the afternoon, the carline will form in two lanes: parents who will exit after car line on SR 46 should enter on the right side of the car loop, those exiting onto Cameron Ave should enter car line on the left. Once your car arrives at the stop sign, the car line volunteer will instruct you to pull forward using both lanes. Please pull all the way forward as close to the car in front of you as possible. Students will be matched to car line tags and assisted into cars by safety patrols. Once every car in line is ready, that line will be dismissed to drive around the building, and out the Cameron Ave exit.

**Zone 2** (3:30 dismissal for grades 3-5) cars will arrive after 3:30 and follow the zone 1 procedures. We ask that zone 2 cars refrain from arriving early as those students will not be in car line until 3:30. To ensure a smooth and efficient car line, cars arriving before their scheduled time will be asked to pull around and get back in line until their students are ready for pick up.

Zone 3 (3:40 for Middle School students) cars will arrive after 3:40 and follow the zone I procedures. We ask that zone 3 cars refrain from arriving early as those students will not be in car line until 3:40. To ensure a smooth and efficient car line, cars arriving before their scheduled time will be asked to pull around and get back in line until their students are ready for pick up.

### <u>**Important Notes:**</u>

- Children will exit and enter vehicles on the driver's side of the car.
- Please wait to be flagged for dismissal from carline.
- In the afternoon: If you are in the left lane, you will exit Cameron Ave. Those in the right lane will exit onto SR 46.
